

1. Where are you now? Are you in Ukraine or elsewhere?

Rinat Akhmetov: "I am in Ukraine now, I arrived in Ukraine the day before the war broke out, and I have been here all this time."

2. What was your position in 2014, when the so-called Euromaidan uprising erupted? Is it true that, on that occasion, you organised pro-Kyiv demonstrations in Mariupol?

Rinat Akhmetov: "In 2014, I strongly condemned separatism and the creation of the so-called Donetsk People's Republic and called them terrorists who intimidated people (my addresses on 19 and 20 May 2014 are attached). I believe that Donbas can be happy only as part of a united Ukraine, both then and now. As for Mariupol, following my calls, the Ukrainians took to the streets, kicked separatists out of the city, and saved the Ukrainian Mariupol in 2014."

3. What properties did you have in the Donetsk People's Republic? Do you still have the formal ownership or were they nationalized? How much have you lost?

Rinat Akhmetov: "There is no "Donetsk People's Republic". All the assets owned by my company in Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts (regions), as well as in the Autonomous Republic of Crimea (the Ukrainian territories temporarily occupied by the Russian Federation) were "nationalised" by the so-called authorities of the unrecognised "republics" and the Russian Federation. My house and Donbass Arena, a top football stadium well known to Italian fans, were "nationalised" as well. Loss estimates stand at dozens of billions of dollars. The scope of damage will be assessed in the lawsuits, as was the case with the court proceedings initiated against the Russian Federation for compensation of damages caused to my companies by the illegal annexation of the Crimea."

4. What among your industrial infrastructures has been damaged during the conflict? What is the financial estimate of the damage that you have sustained?

Rinat Akhmetov: "Following the large-scale offensive of the Russian Federation on 24 February 2022, such plants as Azovstal, Illich Iron and Steel Works of Mariupol, Avdiivka Coke, Luhansk TPP, and dozens of other industrial infrastructure and green energy facilities have been partially or completely destroyed or mothballed. The pre-war capitalisation of these assets was over US\$ 20 billion."

5. As some newspapers have reported, the Metinvest holding is preparing lawsuits against Russia for damages for the destruction of the Mariupol Ilyich Iron and Steel Works and Azovstal. Can you give us more information about that? It is correct that the capitalization of the two plants before Russia's military invasion was at least \$10 billion?

Rinat Akhmetov: "Yes, that's correct. The pre-war capitalisation of our two plants — Azovstal and Illich Iron and Steel Works — was at least US\$ 10 billion. In addition, they had working capital (raw materials and finished products) worth \$1 billion. We will definitely lodge claims against the Russian Federation, demanding to compensate all the damages caused by the Russian military aggression."

6. Do you think that this war could have been avoided, by applying the Minsk accords? Did you have any role in the negotiations?

Rinat Akhmetov: "I did not take any part in the Minsk negotiations. War could have been avoided in one way: if Putin had not decided to unleash this cruel and unprovoked war

against a sovereign Ukraine, and if he had not sent his troops in 2014 to the Eastern Ukraine and had not annexed the Crimea illegally."

7. How are you supporting the Ukrainian armed forces and the civilian population?

Rinat Akhmetov: "All SCM businesses, FC Shakhtar, and my Foundation are now focused on a single purpose — to help Ukraine win the war, and help Ukrainian civilians survive. SCM businesses support the viability of the country, providing electricity and energy resources. Our humanitarian mission is another area of focus. We are supplying medicines and food products, evacuating people, and helping the Ukrainian Army. We have already allocated €100 million to help the country, with more than 50% of the money already disbursed. And we will keep helping. You can find more detailed information about what we are doing in the attachment."

8. Have you ever financed or supported Ukrainian paramilitary groups?

Rinat Akhmetov: "We have been helping and continue to help the Ukrainian Army and Territorial Defence Forces."

9. President Zelensky approved the so-called Anti-Oligarch law. How has this law affected your business?

Rinat Akhmetov: "I am confident that this law does not apply to me. I am the biggest private investor, employer, and taxpayer in Ukraine."

10. Has Zelensky ever accused you of having planned a coup? What was your reply? What is your current relationship with the Ukrainian government?

Rinat Akhmetov: "President Zelensky has never personally accused me of plotting a coup. After he made allegations about possible attempts to involve me in plotting a coup, I immediately stated that this was an absolute lie. There was not a single fact or evidence for such allegations, there was not and could not be. Time and my actions have proven me right. The President and Government of Ukraine, every Ukrainian and I personally are united by one common goal — to defend the country, bring back our territories, and rebuild Ukraine as a strong democratic European state. We are all united like never before. This is key to our victory."

11. You have said that you will rebuild Mariupol. Do you think that Mariupol could return to Ukraine? If the city was annexed to Russia or to the Donetsk People's Republic, what would you do? In this case, what do you think would happen to your business? Would you continue to do business in Mariupol?"

Rinat Akhmetov: "For me, Mariupol has been and will always be a Ukrainian city. Mariupol can be rebuilt only under the Ukrainian control. There cannot be any other options for me. None of SCM businesses will ever operate under the Russian control."

12. Do you have business in Italy and Europe? What are your economic interests in Italy and Europe?

Rinat Akhmetov: "We are a transnational company. We have two works in Italy, Metinvest Trameal in San Giorgio di Nogaro and Ferriera Valsider in Verona. Their annual output is more than 1 million tonnes of flat steel products. We also own plants in the UK and Bulgaria. Russian aggression has significantly complicated our production processes in Italy, as Azovstal plant, a slab supplier, has been bombed out. Our business commits its future to

Europe, and we have plans to build a new plant in Italy with the capacity of 2 million tonnes of rolled steel.”

13. How does this war affect the steel industry in the Western World?

Rinat Akhmetov: “The war of the Russian Federation against Ukraine has extremely negative consequences for all segments of the global economy, including the steel industry: rising prices, broken supply chains, problems with logistics and raw materials. The Azovstal plant, which has been bombed out by Russian troops, was one of the largest suppliers of slabs and thick plates to Europe, including Italy.”

14. What were your economic relations with Russia before 2014? And before 24

February 2022? Do you have any economic or business relations now with Russia?

Rinat Akhmetov: “Before 2014, our economic relations had been the same as those of the European Union: a significant bilateral trade. After 2014, we significantly reduced the bilateral trade and widely pursued the market diversification. As the war broke out in 2022, we severed all economic and business ties, and now we have no assets in Russia.”

15. After the collapse of the Soviet Union, you became the richest man in Ukraine. How did you manage that? What is the source of your wealth? Workers received state-owned company shares. How did you acquire the controlling stake?

Rinat Akhmetov: “I was born to, and raised in, a very humble family. And I do know poverty. In the 1990s, the Soviet Union collapsed, and the economy was disrupted. It was a very difficult time for everyone, but we looked to the future with hope though, and everyone was then looking for a job, looking for new opportunities. There was no business as we know it now, it was just in its infancy, and trading reigned supreme. Together with partners, we established a company and started trading too — the coal and coke. And step by step, we started to get the hang of it. It was later, in mid-90s, when I used the trading profits to establish Donetsk City Bank, which became my gateway to financial resources. Thus, I was able to buy the dying industrial enterprises no one cared about. I built a team, and we started investing in those enterprises, developing them. In 2000, we created SCM which evolved from these companies. Today, SCM is Ukraine's biggest private company, employing almost 200,000 people, paying US\$ 3 billion in taxes to the Ukrainian budgets in 2021 and investing US\$ 11.7 billion over the past decade in the country's energy and energy independence, including US\$ 2 billion in green energy, US\$ 2 billion in gas production, and US\$ 10 billion in steelmaking, including green metallurgy. All assets have been acquired legally and transparently. That is why our company is highly trusted by foreign creditors.”

16. What were your connections with Akhat Bragin, former president of the Shakhtar Donetsk football club, who is believed to have had a criminal background?

Rinat Akhmetov: “Akhat Bragin was a very close friend of mine. He had never had criminal records. He was a kind, honourable person who was doing a lot for our home city, Donetsk. His death is a big tragedy for me personally.”

1. Have you ever financed the Azov Battalion?

Rinat Akhmetov: “No, I have not”.

2. Due to the forced stop of Azovstal, Italian companies and factories are without raw materials. How do you think you will remedy this supply crisis? Do you think there will be a risk of losing jobs?

Rinat Akhmetov: "Our Italian companies have to adjust their operations due to the all-out invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Right now our focus is on making them operate as separate businesses: we are readjusting the supply of raw materials and carrying out repairs (instead of scheduled repairs in August) while realigning the supply chain. We plan to relaunch Metinvest Trameital in June and expect to relaunch Ferriera Valsider in July. Thus, we will maintain the production capacities and preserve jobs".

This is a daily digest of aid and assistance provided by our businesses to Ukraine

SCM is Ukraine's largest investment group that has a global presence. The sole owner and investor of SCM is businessman and philanthropist Rinat Akhmetov.

Since February 24, 2022, SCM businesses, the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation, and FC Shakhtar have already donated over UAH 2.1 billion (about \$72 million) to Ukraine and Ukrainian people. In particular, this amount includes humanitarian aid (food, medicines, essential items, evacuation, shelters, etc.), creation of the biggest archive of Ukrainian witness accounts of the war hostilities committed by Russia, and support for the Ukrainian Armed Forces and the Territorial Defence of Ukraine in dozens of towns and cities (clothes, protective gear, cars, drones, thermal imagers, fortifications, medkits, etc.).

Humanitarian Aid:

Rinat Akhmetov's businesses launched Saving Lives humanitarian project to prevent a humanitarian disaster in Ukraine. They joined efforts with international partners to arrange the procurement, delivery and handing over of food, water and essential items to the cities and towns as well as communities.

Metinvest, UMG Investments, DTEK, and other businesses of Rinat Akhmetov's System Capital Management establish Ukraine Logistics Front, a national and international carrier network. Its goal is to help people, cities, towns, and villages affected by the Russian aggression, deliver the essentials, and support the operation of critical infrastructure facilities.

DTEK

- Free supply of electricity to the medical and military facilities, law enforcers, and bakers in Kyiv city, as well as in Donetsk and Dnipropetrovsk oblasts. The electricity supplied in February and March cost around UAH 75 million.
- The Company hands over 117 vehicles to the Ukrainian Armed Forces and the Territorial Defence Forces, who use them to protect civilians.
- DTEK hands over around 2,000 special emergency tourniquets for the Armed Forces of Ukraine and the Territorial Defence Forces
- DTEK Energy businesses produced about 300 anti-tank hedgehogs to defend Ukrainian cities.
- DTEK provides warehouses to be used for humanitarian assistance and premises to be used as bomb shelters. Supply of food, power generators, and medical supplies for bomb shelters.
- DTEK evacuates more than 2,000 employees and their family members from the war zones. They receive all the necessary transport, medical, and counselling support.

- Together with the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation, the Company purchases and delivers food and medicine for residents of Mykolaiv, Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, and Zaporizhia oblasts.
- DTEK arranges delivery of generators for autonomous power supply to hospitals and local communities in certain regions.
- The Company supplies medicines, food, hygiene products for three children's hospitals in Kyiv, purchases and hands over to Okhmatdyt National Children's Hospital five state-of-the-art wound treatment systems.
- DTEK Bilozerska mine provides 70 beds with mattresses, pillows, and bed linen to kindergartens in Bilozerske, which will accommodate the internally displaced people from the areas of active hostilities.
- DTEK Academy: has developed an online programme to overcome anxiety.
- Corum prepares three bomb shelters in Druzhkivka and Kharkiv for employees and local residents, as well as delivers water and overalls.
- DTEK Kurakhivska TPP employees help distribute drinking water in Kurakhove, Donetsk Oblast.
- DTEK Pavlohradvuhillia dormitories in Pershotravensk accommodate people from other Ukrainian regions, as well as local emergency response teams of State Emergency Service of Ukraine. The miners provide the first responders in Pavlohrad with a gasoline truck.
- DTEK Renewables buys first-aid supplies for the Territorial Defence Forces and two power generators for Mykolaiv Oblast.
- DTEK Renewables hands over to border guards an off-road vehicle, power generator, and computer devices.
- DTEK TPPs make up for the shutdown of power units at Zaporizhia Nuclear Power Plant.
- DTEK secures additional coal imports from Poland to keep TPPs running in war times.
- DTEK Energy provides to local military administration in Vinnytsia Oblast beds, mattresses and pillows for the internally displaced people; to Territorial Defence Forces – fortification tools such as concrete blocks, rebars, and cinder bags. Territorial defenders in Lviv Oblast receive portable radios.
- DTEK Energy introduces radiation monitoring at its enterprises.
- DTEK receives 220 Starlink systems that will help restore power supply in combat zones quicker, even in the areas with restricted communications.
- The Company provides a diesel generator to the local community in Poltava Oblast.
- DTEK enterprises donate additional 22,000 litres of stabilised condensate, which can be used as fuel for vehicles and equipment as well as for the needs of the Armed Forces of Ukraine and the Territorial Defence Forces.
- More than 20 employees of DTEK Oil&Gas in Poltava become volunteers and help the internally displaced people with clothing, food, and essentials.

- DTEK Energy provides buses to Zelenodolsk community and spends UAH 100,000 on medicines for people in Bilozerske.
- DTEK Energy and the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation buy and deliver almost 10 tonnes of humanitarian aid for Zelenodolsk community.
- DTEK Energy supplies almost 345 tonnes of coal to fuel evacuation trains of Ukrzaliznytsia and 100 tonnes for local communities and social infrastructure facilities.
- DTEK Energy joins efforts with the Centre for Community Engagement operating in Burshtyn under the Local Economic Development Agency in Prykarpattia to launch Children's Smile project. The key objective is to facilitate the social adaptation of internally displaced children and help them find new friends among the little residents of Burshtyn. The same project has been launched in Ladyzhyn town, Vinnytsia Oblast.
- DTEK Group drivers help evacuate Mariupol and Berdiansk residents.
- DTEK Oil & Gas hands over 8 off-road vehicles for the needs of Territorial Defence of Poltava Oblast.
- DTEK Renewables together with the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation provide 55 types of medicines worth UAH 1.6 million to Pershotravensk and Pokrovsk communities in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast and 10 heaters to Pokrovsk community.
- DTEK Renewables and the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation provide 27 tonnes of food packages for Mykolaiv, Dnipropetrovsk, and Zaporizhia oblasts.
- DTEK Group and other energy companies in Ukraine urge the international business community to stop buying Russian energy resources and terminate any exports of components and technologies for fuel and energy industry to Russia. #StopBloodyEnergy has been launched.
- DTEK Energy supplies 3.5 tonnes of fuel to the Armed Forces of Ukraine and local community in Burshtyn.
- In March and April, nearly 200 employees of DTEK Energy in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast donate blood at the request of local medics.
- DTEK Renewables purchases and hands over 330 potable water barrels, 100 tonnes of chicken, 10,000 meat porridge cans, and 4,500 litres of diesel fuel to Mykolayiv and Mykolayiv Oblast.
- DTEK Renewables has purchased 10 portable walkie-talkies for border guards
- DTEK Network's power engineers help their colleagues from Ukrzaliznytsia (Ukrainian national railway network) to restore and put into operation electric networks in Lviv and Kyiv oblasts. 6 teams of DTEK specialists Networks from Dnipropetrovsk and Odesa oblasts with 5 units of special equipment are already working to ensure the sustainable operation of the railway as soon as possible.

Status of the assets: All of DTEK's thermal power plants now operate normally. The only exceptions are Luhansk TPP that was shut down due to hostilities in the region, and partially Zaporizhia TPP which went into self-sufficiency due to the inability to deliver fuel. The thermal power plants currently have fuel supply. Corum Group partially

relocates its production capacities to Khmelnytsky and Volyn oblasts. In April, DTEK reopened 19 customer service centres.

Rebuilding efforts as of 12 May: DTEK deploys all the repair crews to promptly restore power supply. The crews only travel to repair sites if green-lighted by the Ukrainian troops. Over the past day, power engineers have returned light to 7,395 families in Kyiv, Dnipropetrovsk, and Donetsk Oblasts, where active hostilities continue. Over 1.5 million Ukrainian homes have had the electricity back on since February 24.

Metinvest

- Assistance to IDPs (accommodation, food) in all areas where Metinvest Group operates. Metinvest prepares around 6,000 beds to accommodate the internally displaced people. The refugees receive the essentials such as drinking water, food, and medicines.
- The company opens humanitarian aid collection points for residents in Pokrovsk, Zaporizhia, Kryvyi Rih, Myrnohrad, Avdiivka, Kamianske, and Mariupol.
- Metinvest provides 900 tonnes of steel for free to make around 90,000 bulletproof vests for the Ukrainian Army and the Territorial Defence Forces. The Company purchases another 10,000 bulletproof vests abroad, with the fourth batch of 2,700 vests making its way to the troops. Overall, the Company has already delivered 4,000 bulletproof vests and helmets to the frontlines.
- Metinvest purchases 1,100 thermal imagers, over 8,100 helmets, 25,000 medikits and emergency military tourniquets.
- Metinvest businesses hand over 110+ vehicles to Ukrainian defenders.
- Metinvest sources almost two dozen drones to the military.
- The Company supplies 40,000 litres of fuel to the Ukrainian Army and territorial defenders.
- Around 50,000 anti-tank hedgehogs and 20,000 spike strips made of Metinvest's steel are already delivered.
- Metinvest joins efforts with the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation to buy medicines for the cities and towns of their operations. The first batch worth over UAH 30 million arrived in Zaporizhia, Kryvyi Rih, Avdiivka, Myrnohrad, Pokrovsk, and Kamianske.
- Metinvest Group joins forces with AV Metal Group and ZRN Plant of Platform Gratings to launch production of HESCO bastions for the territorial defenders and the Armed Forces of Ukraine. Twenty tonnes of wire rod to make bastions have been supplied already.
- The Company makes available almost 4,000 jobs for IDPs from Mariupol in Zaporizhia, Kryvyi Rih, Kamianske, and Pokrovsk.
- Young employees of Avdiivka Coke are on a round-the-clock duty at the MSL Rehabilitation Centre.
- Female workers of Southern GOK in Kryvyi Rih cook lunches for defenders.

- Kametstal sources 25 oxygen cylinders to Kamianske Town Hospital No. 9 and two S-40 sirens to the local authorities.
- Young employees of Zaporizhstal and Metinvest Promservice supply consumables and essential medicines to Zaporizhia Oblast Perinatal Centre.
- Employees of Zaporizhia Coke Plant donate 20 litres of blood. Over 30 employees of Zaporizhstal also join the blood donation initiative.
- Metinvest Group's Pokrovske colliery uses its facilities to bake bread for the defenders.
- Metinvest Group volunteers gather more than 80,736 kg of humanitarian aid for the war-affected people, which includes food, drinking water, clothes, footwear, medicines, blankets, pillows, etc.
- Pokrovskvuhillia help evacuating people from Volnovakha.
- The company launches the *Metinvest – Together!* psychological support service for employees.
- Kametstal doctors teach Kamianske residents the paramedical first aid.
- Employees of Kryvyi Rih plants provide hot meals to residents and defenders of the city.
- Pokrovskvuhillia provides 50 m³ of lumber for outfitting the bomb shelters and basements in Pokrovsk.
- Pokrovskvuhillia supplies 100 concrete blocks, sand, 50 m³ of lumber for the construction of roadblocks and checkpoints. The welders help make anti-tank hedgehogs for the Territorial Defence Forces. The company also gives defenders the batteries, fuel, food, and essentials.
- Metinvest Group employees help fortify city hospital No. 5 in Zaporizhia.
- Ingulets GOK prepares its recreation centre to accommodate the refugees.
- Northern GOK provides vehicles to the defenders in Kryvyi Rih.
- Since early March, steelmakers of Kametstal have provided over 90 tonnes of oxygen to treat Covid-19 patients. Zaporizhstal rejoined the initiative and shipped 20 tonnes of medical oxygen as soon as it was de-mothballed. Year to date, the companies of the Group have provided 915 tonnes of vitally important oxygen to the Ukrainian medical facilities.
- Kametstal provides 32 hand radios to law enforcers and another 15 to territorial defenders. In addition, the Territorial Defence and law enforcement officers in Kamianske receive two stationary radio communication stations.
- Kametstal power engineer teams restore power supply in the shelter premises of Kamianske.
- Kametstal youth organisation helps sewing protective armour and weave camouflage nets.
- Zaporizhstal creates the Humanitarian Coordination Centre on its premises to help all the regions of Ukraine.

- Motor shops of Metinvest companies in Kryvyi Rih supply over 20 vehicles to the Territorial Defence Forces of Ukraine.
- Metinvest joins efforts with Kryvyi Rih Future Foundation to provide essential medicines to the Centre for Primary Health Care of Lozuvata Village Council.
- Pokrovskvuhillia canteens provide fresh bread to citizens and IDPs.
- The Company purchases 1,610 medical kits worth UAH 700,000 for hospitals in Zaporizhia.
- Metinvest provides accommodation to evacuated Mariupol residents in Zaporizhia.
- Within two weeks by 15 buses, twenty volunteer drivers of Pokrovskvuhillia, Metinvest Group, took out at least a thousand Mariupol residents, including 120 children from local orphanage, who were able to get to Berdiansk on their own.
- Metinvest Group makes available about 4,000 job openings for employees of Mariupol plants through Metinvest Career Centres in Zaporizhia, Kryvyi Rih, Kamianske, and Pokrovsk.
- Metinvest Group has launched a rehabilitation and reintegration centre for IDPs in Zaporizhia.
- Kametstal steelmakers supply 10 tonnes of diesel fuel to providers of utility services in Kamianske.
- Metinvest supports a specialised site set up to repair military motor vehicles in Zaporizhia. The site has already repaired nine vehicles for the Ukrainian Army.
- Rescuers from the State Emergency Service and military medics from Zaporizhia received bulletproof vests from Metinvest.

Status of assets as of 12 May: Mariupol plants and Avdiivka Coke plant are hot mothballed. Zaporizhia Foundry and Mechanical Plant, Zaporizhstal, Zaporizhia Coke Plant, and Zaporizhvohnetryv have partially resumed production. Ore processing plants and the rest of the enterprises operate normally.

Ukrtelecom

- All telephony and internet access services for the retail and corporate subscribers who temporarily cannot pay for the services due to the active hostilities in their territories, are now available on credit.
- TriMob mobile operator provides all roaming services in Vodafone Ukraine, Kyivstar, and lifecell networks.
- The Company arranges shelters for employees and their families in eight localities: Kropyvnytsky, Poltava, Khmelnytsky, Uzhgorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Yaremche, and Ivano-Frankivsk. Total number beds: 233.
- Ukrtelecom cooperates with the Rinat Akhmetov Foundation to provide around 5,000 sq.m of its property for social needs: temporary accommodation of employees and their families displaced due to the war, premises for volunteer activities, storage of humanitarian cargoes, etc.

- Ukrtelecom provides 97 motor vehicles to the Armed Forces of Ukraine and territorial defenders.
- Since the outbreak of the war, the company has paid UAH 400 million in taxes and duties to the national and local budgets.
- The operator's specialists and emergency teams work 24/7, supporting the operation of the company's critical infrastructure and national backhaul.

Status of assets as of 12 May: Ukrtelecom's critical infrastructure and Internet continue operating across Ukraine. Internet services are provided in 86% of localities and can be accessed in all regions except Luhansk Oblast.

Repair works as of 12 May: Ukrtelecom's emergency repair crews continue to restore networks and return services to subscribers. In the Dnipropetrovsk region, the accident on the main network was eliminated and the provision of services for the village of Shiroke was resumed. In Kyiv and Kharkiv regions, short-term interruptions in services may be recorded, and equipment must be rebooted to resume services.

FUIB

- FUIB pays over UAH 299 million in taxes upfront.
- FUIB supports all its banking services and FUIB Online mobile app. Cashless transactions are unrestricted.
- FUIB launches an ad hoc service in the application to ensure quick fundraising for the needs of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, in particular, for 128th mountain assault brigade of Zakarpattia.
- FUIB's PayHub now has a page for quick money transfers to the Armed Forces of Ukraine. Since early days of the war, Ukrainians have transferred more than UAH 250 million to support the Army.
- The bank introduces three-month repayment holiday for current loans. During the holidays, mandatory payments include only interest and a monthly loan fee. Payments on the loan principal are deferred and will be paid during the period for which the loan agreement term is extended.
- The bank cancels fees for acquiring services and fees for using POS terminals.
- FUIB supports the programme for free delivery of humanitarian aid from abroad, which is collected by volunteers globally.
- The Bank hands over most of its armoured vehicles to special forces to protect the country.
- FUIB volunteer community across Ukraine processes more than 1,000 requests and helps accommodate people in health resorts, arranges trains/buses/car convoys for evacuation, finds military gear, helps transfer belongings/documents/medicines, provides fuel, etc.
- FUIB channels UAH 5 million to help its employees, in particular those endangered or constrained due to loss of housing.

- FUIB retains jobs and salaries of its conscripted employees. Bank allocates UAH 207,000 to buy military gear for them, and UAH 1 million to purchase bulletproof vests.
- FUIB launches e-Support, the assistance from the government to Ukrainians in the regions with the most active hostilities (Kyiv City, and Kyiv, Volyn, Donetsk, Zhytomyr, Zaporizhia, Luhansk, Mykolaiv, Odessa, Sumy, Kharkiv, Kherson, and Chernihiv Oblasts).

Status of the assets: The bank outlets operate in almost all regions of Ukraine. The bank resumes operations in Chernihiv and Irpin. FUIB's cash-in-transit guards are risking their lives to do everything they can to fill the bank's ATMs across the country.

Lemtrans

- Levada Cargo joins efforts with other companies and EBA to establish humanitarian supply chains from Europe to Ukraine, having already delivered around 1,500 tonnes of humanitarian aid to war victims.
- Lemtrans allocates around UAH 500,000 to support its humanitarian cargo logistics tariff.
- Supplies food packages and medicines to Popasna town.
- Lemtrans helps with the delivery of 40 tonnes of flour to Zaporizhia.
- The company provides Territorial Defence Forces with fuel, oil and lubricants, anti-tank hedgehogs, and materials for roadblocks, and checkpoints.
- Together with partners, the company bought and handed over four SUVs to the front line

TSUM

- The department store provides 150 warm clothing items to territorial defence forces in Kyiv.
- The department store urges the international partners to stop working with Russia and help Ukraine.
- TSUM provides information support to brands that help the Armed Forces of Ukraine and the Territorial Defence Forces.

HarvEast Holding

- The Company provides help with social bread and milk deliveries in the regions where we operate.
- The Company supplies food to the troops.
- Alongside other agricultural businesses of Ukraine, we urge the world's biggest grain traders to stop buying grains and food supplies from Russia.
- The Company sources 4.5 tonnes of diesel fuel, 5 vehicles, and 2 drones for the Ukrainian troops.

- The Company channels money to procure fuel, special vehicles, and armour for the troops.

UMG Investments

- The Company's procurement and logistics experts start collecting requests from the Territorial Defence fighters, volunteers, search for the necessary supplies and raise funds. Together with its partners, the Company purchases and hands over to Ukrainian defenders hundreds of equipment units and overalls - body armour, helmets, thermal imagers, walkie-talkies, satellite phones, sleeping bags, thermal underwear and footwear.
- Vesco buses help evacuate civilians from Mariupol.

Shakhtar Donetsk Football Club

- In response to a request from the club's representatives, the European Club Association (ECA) will donate €1 million to Ukraine.
- The club deploys a support centre for the internally displaced people at Arena Lviv. Since the outbreak of the war, Shelter Centre has already accepted 500 IDPs from various regions.
- As part of the charity project, Shakhtar Social Foundation, jointly with the European Football for Development Network and Fundacja Legii social foundation, launches a campaign in support of Ukraine and its residents. Thirteen European clubs have already joined the initiative. The first batch of humanitarian cargo for IDPs has already been delivered to Arena Lviv from different Ukrainian regions.
- FC Shakhtar's buses take IDPs to accommodations in Lviv Oblast.
- Also, FC Shakhtar provides clothes worth over UAH 1 million to the Ukrainian troops.
- The Club provides humanitarian assistance to the Armed Forces of Ukraine, territorial defenders and internally displaced people.
- Shakhtar embarks on their Shakhtar Global Tour for Peace in Ukraine charity matches and will channel all proceeds from the sale of tickets and advertising to the defenders of Ukraine, volunteer organisations, doctors, and Ukrainian children affected by the war.
- Shakhtar delivers humanitarian care packages in Lviv Oblast. Targeted assistance arrived in Novy Rozdil Vocational School (Novy Rozdil village), which accommodates the evacuated children from single-parent families and orphans from specialised institutions in eastern regions of Ukraine. The Club employees delivered bed linen, household appliances, food, and hygiene products.
- Shakhtar sends two trucks carrying humanitarian aid (2+ tonnes) for the residents of Bucha Raion in Kyiv Oblast. The aid will be distributed by local authorities in the most war-affected localities.
- Shakhtar Social Foundation's project Come On, Let's Play runs in Lviv and Ivano-Frankivsk oblasts. Activities take place in eight localities and welcome both regular

participants and children displaced from Mariupol, Kurakhove, Kyiv City and Kyiv Oblast.

Media Group Ukraine

- Under the patronage of the Ministry of Culture and the Presidential Office, Media Group Ukraine and other media groups have launched FreeDom, an international broadcasting channel to lead a fightback against Russian propaganda. Media Group Ukraine donates millions of hryvnias every month to support the channel.
